This professional learning is intended to be an active experience providing hands-on practice with the ERWC curriculum. These rich, adaptable resources, developed by a collaborative group of CSU and high school faculty and specialists, are designed to help students develop the academic literacy skills necessary for success in college and the world of work. Aligned with the California Standards for English Language Arts (ELA) and English Language Development (ELD), both courses at grades 11 and 12 are approved to satisfy the "B" English subject requirement for UC and CSU admission. High schools may opt to offer the grade 11 course, the grade 12 course, or both. The modules for grades 9-12 with integrated and designated ELD may be integrated within existing ELA and ELD courses at those grades.

Teachers attending this workshop series will:

- Receive curriculum materials and professional books
- Identify features of effective ERWC classrooms as reflected in the ERWC assignment template and key principles
- Become familiar with ERWC pedagogy and key concepts, including integrated and designated ELD
- Investigate rhetorical reading, writing, and inquiry processes
- Explore ERWC course design—including module overviews that identify learning goals, rhetorical concepts, ELA and ELD standards, and culminating tasks—to make decisions about modules to teach in their classrooms
- Examine specific modules
- Select modules to teach and begin planning for implementation
