IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COMPLETING THE STEPS TO ENROLLMENT

Although the steps are presented in numerical order, keep in mind that you may not necessarily complete all of these steps in the order that they are presented. Refer to MySJSU for specific deadlines and tasks that need to be completed to ensure your enrollment.

STAY COMMITTED TO THE PROCESS

Deadlines are very important and are in place to help you through the enrollment process. You risk having your admission withdrawn if you do not meet our deadlines and maintain your eligibility. To prevent this from happening, sign in to MySJSU (one.sjsu.edu) every few days and thoroughly read any messages, To Do List items, or posted deadlines, and take the requested action as soon as possible.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I do not complete required courses or miss a deadline?

You will have your admission to SJSU revoked and your registration canceled. In particular, failure to submit your high school transcripts will result in your application being withdrawn, even if you have signed up for housing, attended orientation or registered for classes.

What if I am planning to take courses required for admission during the Summer 2025 term?

You may not use coursework from the Summer 2025 term to complete admission requirements.

If I want to take the fall semester off, can I defer admission to another term?

No, your admission offer is good for the Fall 2025 term only. You must attend at least one course during the Fall 2025 semester to maintain your admission. If you do not enroll in courses during the term of your admission and wish to be admitted for a later term, you must submit a new application for the next available term for which you meet the minimum requirements.

Can I change my major?

Because SJSU is an impacted campus, change of major cannot take place prior to the start of the term and is never guaranteed even after admission to SJSU. If you are Undeclared, you will receive more information about declaring your major during orientation.

Submit Intent to Enroll

San José State needs to know if you intend to enroll so that we can plan for your enrollment in Fall 2025. To submit your intent to enroll, go to the Next Steps Intent to Enroll website (nextsteps.sjsu.edu) and complete the multi-step process by 11:59 p.m. (Pacific Daylight Time) no later than the date posted on your MySJSU To Do List. Note that if you do not meet this deadline we will assume that you do not want to attend SJSU and your admission will be withdrawn.

The Next Steps Intent to Enroll process includes accepting SJSU's offer of admission, signing up for mandatory orientation, and paying the \$250 nonrefundable enrollment deposit.

Sign Up Sign Up for Sparta Camp (Orientation)

Sparta Camp is the mandatory two-day, in-person, orientation program that will introduce you to the campus and its resources, connect you to your college and major department, and provide you with critical academic planning information. All admitted students are required to attend this mandatory orientation for the entire duration of the program. Overnight accommodations available for students traveling from out of the area. The cost to attend orientation will be included in your \$250 enrollment deposit.

Before attending Sparta Camp (orientation), complete Spartan Link (spartanlink.sjsu.edu) online pre-orientation.

During orientation, we will:

- Discuss and explain key university services
- Facilitate connections with other staff, faculty and your fellow incoming students
- Host a General Education advising workshop to help in planning your academic schedule

Trained orientation leaders will:

- Answer some of your initial questions
- Provide you with information about campus programs and services
- Assist you in making the transition to college

If you do not attend, or leave during any portion of the program, you will be blocked from registering for classes and will not be able to attend SJSU in Fall 2025. Students who arrive late will not be allowed to attend the program.

Parents and family members are invited to attend Parent and Family Orientation, held concurrently with your Sparta Camp session. Registration for parents and families is located in the SJSU Parent and Family Portal (sjsu.campusesp.com). Overnight accommodations not provided for families/guests of the new student.

DetermineFirst Year Writing and Math Course Placement

To facilitate appropriate first-year course placement, the CSU evaluates your academic preparation in two areas: written communication and math/quantitative reasoning.

The evaluation takes into account several factors, including overall grade point average, mathematics grade point average, completed terms of secondary coursework, grades in certain senior-year classes, the Reflection on College Writing, and scores on standardized tests such as the SAT, ACT, CAASPP/EAP, CLEP, Advanced Placement, Advanced Level, Advanced Subsidiary, and International Baccalaureate examinations.

Though SJSU will not consider SAT/ACT scores in our evaluation of your record for admission, please submit any available official SAT/ACT scores as they could help determine your first-year course placement.

First Year Writing Course Placement

Freshmen entering SJSU will complete an online Reflection on College Writing exercise to explore writing at SJSU and to choose the course they need. The online exercise is offered through Canvas (SJSU's online course tool), and will be available at the beginning of June. Be alert for emails and MvSJSU messages about the Reflection on College Writing.

To ensure that you will be able to register for your first-year writing course during Sparta Camp (orientation), complete all modules in your Reflection on College Writing at least two weeks prior to your orientation session. Messages and emails will be posted if there are sections that are not fully complete; be sure to monitor MySJSU and your @sjsu.edu email account. First Year Math Course Placement

Your math placement is dependent upon your major and your enrollment category. You can confirm your major by reviewing your admission letter. To determine your math course placement and whether you may need to participate in preliminary coursework this summer, please complete both of the following:

- Determine if your major requires Calculus by viewing the Majors Requiring Calculus (STEM) list at sjsu.

- If your major requires Calculus, please review the Precalculus Proficiency Assessment section below

Precalculus Proficiency Assessment (PPA)

If your major requires calculus, you will be required to take the Precalculus Proficiency Assessment (PPA) unless:

You have earned a three or better on the AP Calculus Exam. Request to have the appropriate testing
agency send your official score report to SJSU as soon as it is available.

 You have earned a "C-" or better in a transferable Pre-Calculus level course at a community college. Send us your official transcript reflecting this work as soon as possible.

If you took the Calculus AP exam in high school and have not yet sent us your scores, please contact the Testing Office at testing-office@sjsu.edu to determine your next steps.

If you feel that your assigned mathematics enrollment category is not accurate, you may submit an appeal. For your appeal to have merit, it must bring to light new or missing information that was not considered in the original determination. Transfer coursework submitted after the transcript deadline or test scores sent after the official test score deadline are the basis for an appeal. Immunizations and Records

As a new student, you will need to provide proof of immunizations prior to the first day of classes to avoid delays with housing applications, class registration and/or participation in programs.

CSU Required Immunization

• Hepatitis B Vaccine: Full immunization series completed. All incoming students who are 18 years of age or younger on the first day of their first term must submit proof of Hepatitis B immunization.

Additional Requirements for SJSU University Housing and International Students

- Meningococcal conjugate (MenACWY) vaccine
- Tuberculosis (TB) screening form (available in Student Wellness Center Patient Portal)

CompleteImmigration Document Process

F-1 Visas

Coming from a U.S. Institution

To complete this process, you must do the following: Show your admission letter and the SJSU "SEVIS Transfer In Form" to your current school's international office. You can find the form at sisu.edu/isss/docs/SJSU%20Transfer%20IN%20Form%20F-1%20students.pdf

This form is not mandatory but optional; it is used to let your current institution know that you wish to transfer to SJSU. Once your current institution sends your electronic I-20 document through SEVIS, then you will receive a Transfer-Pending Form I-20 from SJSU.

Coming from Outside the U.S.

We will issue your I-20 once we have received the items below. Please check MySJSU for additional details.

- Completed Intent to Enroll (https://nextsteps.sjsu.edu)
- · Bank Letter/Statement
- Declaration of Finance
- Copy of Passport

Customs and Immigration at the Airport

Please expect this process to be a lengthy experience and prepare in advance. You must keep the following documents in your carry-on luggage so you are able to present them to a Customs and Border Patrol officer:

- Passport (must be valid for at least six months after the date of entry)
- F-1 visa stamp, valid at the time of entry
- Form I-20, must be valid
- Proof of financial support and resources reflected on Form I-20
- Tuition and/or Housing receipt(s), if you have made payments prior to your arrival
- · SEVIS fee receipt

Canadian citizens are not required to apply for a visa to enter the U.S. as an F-1, but must still pay the SEVIS Fee and present their Form I-20 at the U.S. port of entry.

Submit Final Official Transcripts (with Graduation Date)

We will review your final official transcripts to verify that you completed all required courses for admission. This includes passing required courses with a "C-" or better.

Final transcripts must include your graduation date and must be submitted by **Tuesday, July 15.**

You will also be required to submit official college transcripts for any courses completed at all of institutions, universities or community colleges that you have attended.

If you have AP, AL, AS, IB or CLEP exam results, please have official score reports sent to SJSU by the testing agency as soon as they are available so that the scores arrive on time.

Third Party Sponsors

If a Third Party Sponsor, such as a foreign government agency or business and/or educational institution, agrees to sponsor you by paying your tuition and fees, please get an authorization letter from the sponsor specifying how much of your tuition they will cover and for which semesters. Submit the authorization to SJSU's Bursar's Office, Attention: Third Party Sponsor or email the authorization to: student-sponsors-waivers@sjsu.edu and retain a copy of the letter for your records.

The Bursar's Office will invoice the sponsor as appropriate for tuition and fees after the add/drop period as long as the sponsored student is registered and has submitted a current letter of authorization. Learn more at sjsu.edu/bursar/our-services/waivers-sponsors/3rd-party.php

Financial Aid

Please note that international students are not eligible for federal or state financial aid.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available to international students through SJSU's Financial Aid & Scholarship Office. International students are only eligible for scholarships that are merit-based. Need-based scholarships are part of financial aid, which is unavailable to international students. To get more information on scholarships, visit the SJSU Financial Aid & Scholarship Office.

Installment Payment Plans

The university offers payment plans to assist students and their families in making their payments over a period of time. Two payment plans are offered for the Fall and Spring semesters:

- Tuition and fees payment plan
- Housing payment plan

Students may sign up for both plans if needed and each payment plan has a \$35 fee. The initial payment includes campus mandatory fees, optional Student Involvement and Representation (SIRF) fee, First Day Solutions charges and miscellaneous class fees. These fees must be paid by your payment due date and are not included in the installments.

Eligible charges that can be divided into installment payments include tuition fees, non-California resident fees, and graduate professional business program fees. A student must have a minimum of \$1,000 in eligible charges to qualify for the payment plan.

International Wire Transfers

International students can now make payments via international wire transfer.

San José State University has partnered with Flywire to streamline the tuition payment process for our international students. Flywire offers excellent foreign exchange rates, allowing you to pay in your home currency and save a significant amount of money compared to traditional banks. You will be able to track the progress of your payment throughout the transfer process via a student dashboard and you will also be notified via email when your payment is received by San José State.

There is no fee charged by SJSU or Flywire for international wire transfers; however, the bank used to send the wire transfer may charge a fee so check with that bank for the fee schedule.

Field Trip Fees

A few courses have additional field trip fees ranging from \$11 to \$52.

Special or Optional Fees

Parking permits are available for students. A daily one-semester parking permit is estimated at \$192.

Refunds

Students are highly encouraged to enroll in Direct Deposit. With Direct Deposit, you receive your refund several days quicker than a paper check and more securely. Bookstore Charges

Registered students can charge books and supplies purchased at the Spartan Bookstore to their MySJSU student account up to \$900 per semester. For more details visit sjsu.edu/bursar/our-services/spartan-bookstore-voucher.php

Keeping Your MySJSU Account Current

SJSU has established a business practice whereby all payments apply to the oldest debt on your account. For example, if you are making a registration payment and you have a housing debt with an earlier due date, the payment will apply to the housing charges first. Keep your account current to avoid the possibility of enrollment cancellation.

Any delinquent outstanding charges owed to the university will be submitted to the Franchise Tax Board for tax refund offset. The university, or its agent, has the right to pursue collections in order to repay a delinquent debt owed to the university.

Attend Global Spartan Welcome

Students who will be attending SJSU on an F-1 Visa are required to attend Global Spartan Welcome (GSW), a program specifically for international students. During Global Spartan Welcome, you will receive information on how to maintain your F-1 status and other useful information to help you adjust to your new life at SJSU.

International freshmen are required to attend Global Spartan Welcome in two parts:

- Part 1: Webinar (90 minutes)--Covers critical information regarding your F-1 visa status
- Part 2: In-person Session (full day)--Connects you with international peers, introduces you to the U.S. academic system, prepares you for cultural transition.

Provisional Admission

This offer of provisional admission is based on the information you reported on your Cal State Apply application. All of your academic information must be verified before you will be allowed to enroll and register for classes at SJSU. Your admission will remain "provisional" until your official, final transcript(s) passes verification.

This offer of provisional admission to the academic plan (major) listed on your admission letter is only valid for this term and may not be deferred to another semester. In addition, change of major cannot be made before the beginning of the Fall 2025 semester and is not guaranteed. You must enroll in at least one course during the Fall 2025 semester to maintain your admission.

Mandatory Steps to Enrollment

To ensure your enrollment and attendance at SJSU, all of the mandatory steps below must be completed.

- 2. Sign up for SJSU's mandatory frosh orientation.
- Pay the nonrefundable fee for the mandatory enrollment deposit. Your nonrefundable enrollment deposit includes frosh orientation payment and a deposit toward a portion of your tuition and fees for Fall 2025.

College Writing Exercise - Reflection on College Writing
