



Reading and Analysis



Character Studies:

Thematic Exploration:

Creative Projects

Monologues:

Students create and perform monologues from the perspective of characters coming to terms with self-forgiveness, deepening their understanding of the emotional landscape.

Artistic Expression:

Create visual art pieces that represent themes of redemption and self-acceptance, allowing for personal interpretation and expression.
