# Humanization of Gothic Literature through the "Other":

- What does it teach?
  - The perspective of the "others", the outcasts, the villains, the disenfranchised
- Why is it important?
  - To provide a voice for the vilified of the literary world
  - Challenges the "us versus them" trope
  - Weakens the concept of "good" and "evil"
    - Human made constructs that are subjective and debatable depending on context

#### We Were Here by Matt de la Peña

- Follows the story of three young boys through the perspective of Miguel
- Miguel's insight challenges the typical stereotypes placed on his and his friends characters
- Literary context provides the ability to empathize with Miguel and the other two boys
- We Were Here presents all the factors that are involved in creating Miguel's, Rondell's, and Mong's realities: environmental/social/cultural

# *Frankenstein* by Mary Shelley

 Mary Shelley's classic Frankenstein is a prime example of the easy vilification of the "other" due to the imbalance of power within society
