Being in the heart of Silicon Valley, it's important that our campus spaces reflect the technology-driven ethos of the region and that our students are prepared for tomorrow's careers. President Teniente-Matson recently announced that we will be assessing and developing a plan to upgrade our classrooms and future-proof our technology. We will be creating a strategy roadmap based on the needs of our students, faculty, and staff in classrooms and all teaching and learning spaces across our campus. We must equip our university learning spaces to empower the education experiences of future pedagogies.

San José State University has engaged Deloitte's Higher Ed practice to collaborate in developing a comprehensive multi-year strategy for our university's academic and learning space technology.
