Name of Nominee: Lorraine Williams Pedretti, M.S., OTR/Retired

Rationale for Nomination and Substantiation of Influence

It is my honor to nominate Lorraine Williams Pedretti as an Influential Leader for the Occupational Therapy Centennial Celebration. Lorraine's significant contribution is the creation of one of the first (1981 – First Edition) and most highly regarded textbooks devoted to occupational therapy treatment for persons with physical disabilities. Soon to be in its 8th edition, this stellar publication (Elsevier) called Pedretti's Occupational Therapy: Practice Skills for Physical Dysfunction is used throughout the United States and in Occupational Therapy programs around the world. It has been translated into four different languages including Japanese and Korean. The book has been consistently identified as one of the top 10 publications used by NBCOT in providing evidence for item writers for the Occupational Therapy Certification Examination and is frequently cited in AOTA documents including the Occupational Therapy Practice Framework. The array of contributors to the book represent the most highly recognized experts in their areas of knowledge and practice specialties – a tradition initiated by Lorraine Pedretti. The book has continually been known for its accessibility and practical application supported by cutting edge research and evidence. It was Lorraine Williams Pedretti's vision and devoted hard work that culminated in this significant and ongoing contribution to the profession of occupational therapy.

On a personal note, it was my privilege to have Lorraine Williams as my instructor for Physical Disabilities while I was earning my Certificate in Occupational Therapy at San Jose State University in 1972. Lorraine was an excellent teacher who conveyed the care, concern, and dedication for providing practical and cutting edge intervention for this unique population. At the time we had access to the fourth edition of Willard and Spackman - information which was augmented by Professor Williams' own mimeographed materials (including splinting and treatment protocols) which were presented in a course manual. Her enthusiasm for working with this population inspired me to devote my career in OT to treating adults with physical disabilities at Rancho Los Amigos Rehabilitation Center in Southern California. As my career progressed I became aware of the "Pedretti Book" when interning OT students at Rancho (from programs all over the country) brought forth and consulted their "bibles"! I then realized that the "Pedretti" was Lorraine Williams Pedretti! my former teacher and I was so proud and impressed at her accomplishment! Not a surprise but what an achievement to have the vision and the



fortitude to take on such a monumental project. It was beautifully written and reflected the knowledge and professional level of practice I was experiencing at Rancho! It was truly a valuable tool for not only occupational therapists but other members of the rehabilitation team who wanted to understand the gamut of concerns regarding physical disabilities.

Years later – I returned to San Jose State University as a member of the OT faculty and was fortunate to be mentored by Lorraine as I assumed her "Phys Dys" courses. She was just incredibly giving and empowering! To my surprise and honor, I was encouraged by her to become the co-editor with my colleague Winifred Schultz-Krohn of the 6th and subsequent editions of the Pedretti book. Lorraine Pedretti's stellar exemplar encouraged us to seek and achieve the tradition of excellence the book enjoyed. Rather than keep these skills relegated to the smaller audience of a single OT program, Lorraine Pedretti's willingness to dedicate her hard work to developing a textbook (and other related learning materials) opened up high quality occupational therapy knowledge to everyone. I believe she made a significant contribution to the profession, the lives of people with physical disabilities and deserves recognition as an Influential Leader!
