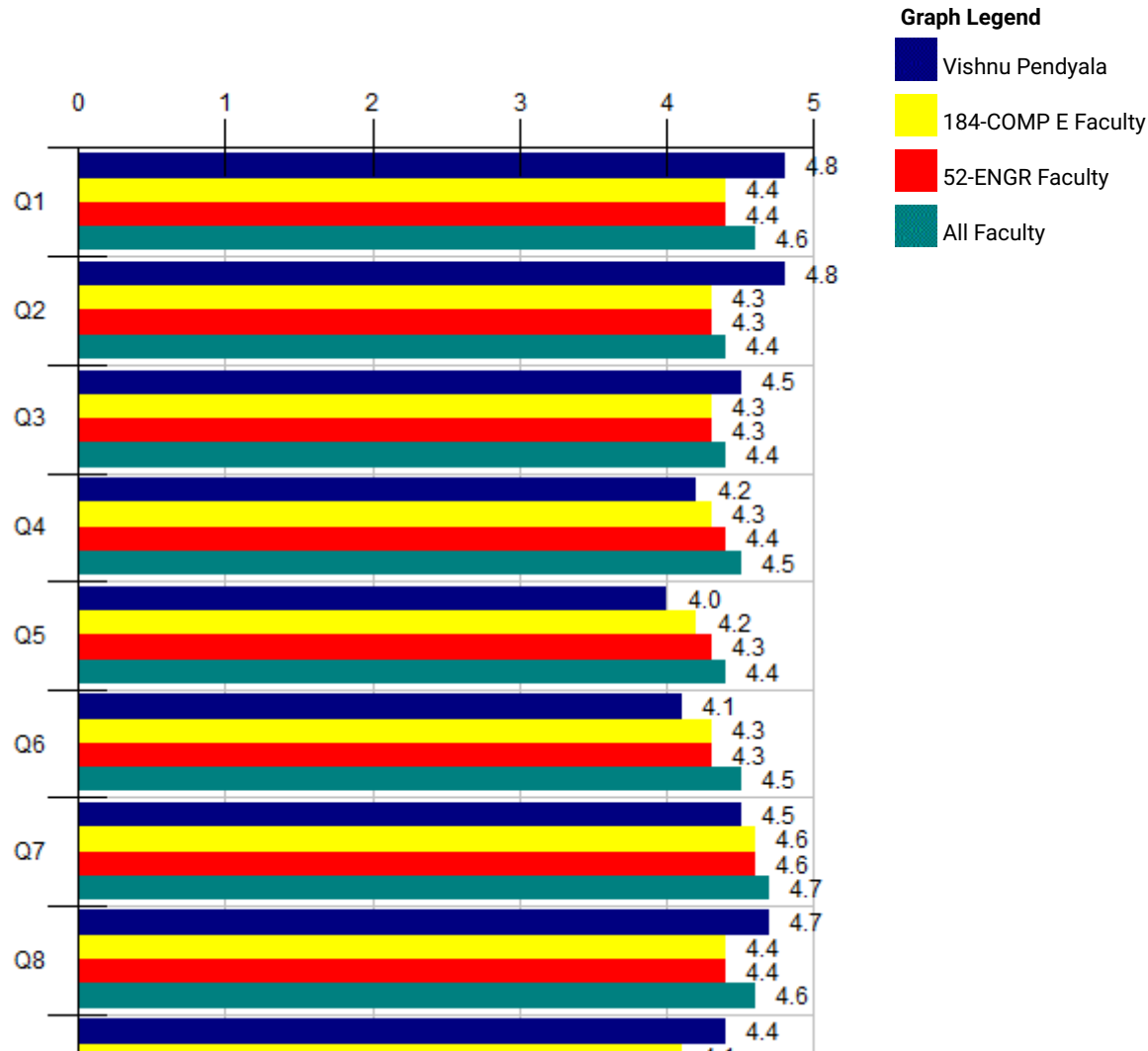


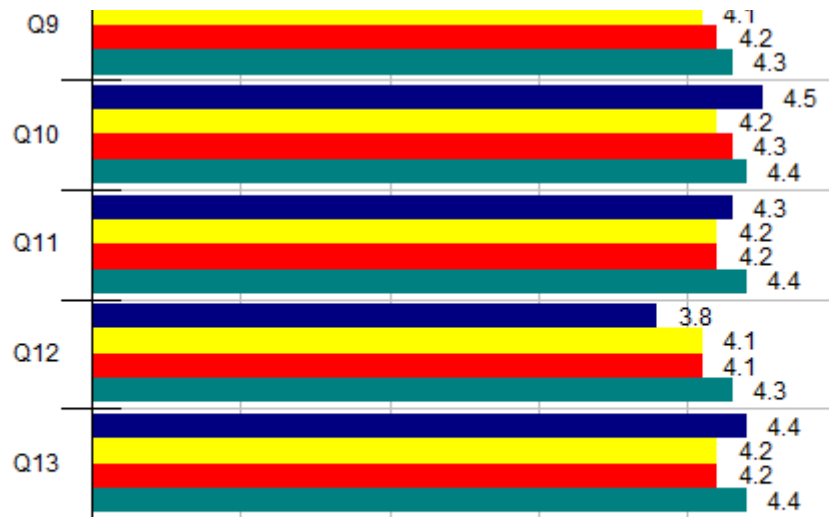

- 1 increase the weightage to individual assignments as they are great way to learn and they take time to complete as compared to quiz and other forms of tests in cmpe 255.
- 2 When asked a question, he shouldn't make any unnecessary remark such as "I don't see any confusion" because it will intimidate student to approach him for further discussion
- 3 Though the quality of assignments given were helpful in our learning, the quantity was more and hence it was difficult to concentrate on other subjects' assignment.
- 4 The rubrics defined are sometimes too much detailed, and it becomes really hard for me to track each and every thing. I am not sure if its a good thing or bad, but it really keeps me on edge, so much that I find it hard to pay attention to other subjects.
- 5 Professor is overly protective of his material and makes it impossible to obtain any feedback from quizzes or assignments. He is very condescending towards students and doesn't teach well over Zoom. He gave zero demos or in-class exercises.

Prof always makes references that you should have learnt this in Statistics, Finance or even does remarks like this is something a middle or high school student would know.

I whole-heartedly believe that if the professor respectfully requests the cooperation of his students in the beginning

4 of the semester to not distribute any of the course content online and tell them that this is to allow better feedback for the students themselves, they would oblige. Learning from mistakes and being able to go over past quizzes/midterms is A HUGE opportunity for growth and it should not be taken away from students because some bad apples decide to break the rules.

8 I have already read this subject of Data mining in my under grad classes, but the concept clarity and how things works,here I came to know. I applaud him. He is one of the sincere and hard working professor I have come across in my life

9 He was not very receptive to questions asked during lectures. If a question was asked about earlier course material or a previous slide, he would answer saying he already covered that before and make it seem like the student was not paying attention when in reality the student was still confused by previous material. For the projects he did not facilitate deduplication in project ideas among students which led to coincidental similar project topics which he became upset at and verbally accused students of cheating even though students had no way of knowing who was working on what project. It created a tense learning environment for the entire class.

10 He tells his passion is Math but spends very less time explaining any math in class, he spends time referencing when that math was learnt by him - in his middle school or in his course work in statistics or during his MBA etc. Instead can take the same amount of time to quickly explain the basic Math. He unnecessarily complicates and makes things sound more complex. When in reality things are quite straight forward and simple.
