It Gets Under the Skin: Intersectional Discrimination and the Health of LGBTQ People of Color

Dr. James J. García is an Assistant Professor of Psychology at Cal State Fullerton. He received his Ph.D. in Clinical Health Psychology from the University of North Texas. Dr. García completed his pre-doctoral clinical internship at the Southern Arizona VA Health Care System, a Postdoctoral Fellowship in Clinical Health/Rehabilitation Neuropsychology at Casa Colina Hospital and Centers for Healthcare and is a Distinguished Faculty Fellow of the Center for Health Equity Research (CHER) at CSU Long Beach. Clinically, he has worked with medical populations for over a decade, delivering health psychology interventions and neuropsychological evaluations to communities of color, Spanish speakers, and LGBTQ+ patients across the continuum of medical care. In addition to teaching and clinical work, Dr. García has been involved in national and local community-based organizations, including as Vice President of Outreach and Community Engagement for the Pomona Pride Center. Currently, he is the Chair of the Interprofessional Health Committee and is a member of the Stroke Leadership Council of the American Heart/Stroke Association.
